Been overseas recently?



Whether you're returning home or visiting New Zealand, protect kiwifruit orchards from unwanted pests and diseases that could affect jobs, income, and the community.

Before entering New Zealand:

- Clean clothing and footwear worn during visits to orchards, nurseries or fruit processors. Brush off plant material from clothing.
- Dry cleaning is effective for killing fungal spores.
- Brush boots and shoes clean of dirt and plant material and sanitise, with Varicide or Janola.
- It is preferable not to bring home tools or equipment used on orchards overseas. If you do, ensure they are free of plant material, washed and sanitised.
- Check cameras and binoculars cases for plant fragments and wipe inside and out.
- Clean sports equipment such as boots and golf clubs, and remove any soil.



On arrival in New Zealand:

- Declare or dispose of risk goods such as food items or plant material.
- Answer all questions honestly, even if it means a short delay in getting through border clearance.
- Notify border officials of your involvement in horticulture and declare any visits to an orchard or farm while overseas.
- Declare equipment used on any orchards overseas.
- Ensure clothing is clean and footwear sanitised before entering a New Zealand orchard.
- Never use tools and equipment from another orchard without cleaning and sanitising first.
